








SHS Raises the Academic Bar for Students; Requests Support for Bo

Sheridan High School Principal Jason Hohnbaum reminded the Sheridan City Council that the School Board voted last July to close the SHS campus during the lunch period. As a result, students must now earn the opportunity to leave the campus during lunch period. This change was based on tardies and absences related to students leaving campus at lunchtime. He said the new rules have resulted in 63 percent fewer tardies and 39 percent fewer

absences in classes that following lunchtime. Jason asked Council members if they were aware of any economic impact resulting from having half as many students out in the community during the lunch break.

The principal said the school also forfeited the Oct. 6 football game because 17 of the 24 SHS student-athletes were ineligible to play because of their grades. The principal said they are raising the academic bar at SHS, which in-

cludes holding students accountable. The principal said he made it clear to the football players that they would not be stepping out onto that field if they were failing classes. He said the school staff does their best to support students with after-school study halls. He said they've also ensured that teachers communicate regularly with coaches, athletic directors, and administrative staff. SHS staff realizes that it will take a group effort to succeed, Jason noted. The principal said it is already working; 22 of the 24 football team members were eligible to play in the Oct. 14 game. The Council joined together in a round of applause for the principal's efforts to hold athletes and all students to higher standards. The principal also noted that a district-wide substance abuse task force has been formed and said all interested are invited to the next committee meeting set for 4:30 p.m. on Nov. 9 at the district office. Jason said they've had good communication and support from the Yamhill County Sheriff's office.

supporting the passage of Measure 36-222, which asks voters to approve a \$16 million bond for renovations and safety improvements to Sheridan High School and Faulconer-Chapman School. The district has been awarded a \$4 million State grant that will be available only if Measure 36-222 is approved. If the measure passes, the Sheridan School District will have a total of \$20 million to finance these capital costs.

If passed, property taxes in Sheridan would remain at 2021 rates. Because the previous bond was paid off, the new bond would, more or less, take its place.

Superintendent Dorie Vickery said the bond committee discussed expanding career technical education (CTE). She said, "The school district values career technical education, and we want to make that opportunity available for our students - either at the Barbara Roberts facility or the high school."

Dorie summed up the discussion by saying, "Good schools draw families. A good robust economy in this community will draw families. These things must go hand in hand. The District has to partner with the City. I am super excited about the things going on in this community. I'm certainly excited to be going into my third year with the district. We've got to have a robust economy, more workforce development, and good schools. That's what we are working toward. Safety, good education, rigor, the relevance of our curriculum, and holding our kids accountable are all important factors."



Hit-and Miss Engine on Display at Sheridan Museum

A hit-and-miss engine or Hit 'N' Miss is a type of stationary internal combustion engine controlled by a governor to only fire at a set speed. They are usually 4-stroke, but 2-stroke versions were made. It was conceived in the late 19th century and produced by various companies from the 1890s through approximately the 1930s when more modern designs began to replace them. The name comes from the speed

control on these engines: they fire ("hit") only when operating at or below a set speed and cycle without firing ("miss") when they exceed their set speed.

The machine pictured was the property of the late Rocky Gutbrod, who got the engine from relatives in the midwest. Margie Gutbrod explained that the hit-andmiss was used to operate washing machines and refrigerators back in the day, kind of like a generator.

Rocky gave the engine to Ed Banke to restore years ago. (Rocky and Margie's daughter is married to Ed Banke's son.) Ed did a beautiful job with the restoration and will eventually give the engine to Trevor Banke, the grandson of both Rocky and Ed. Currently, the hit-and-miss is on display at the Sheridan Museum of History (open 10 a.m.-3 p.m. Saturdays), where it fit through the front door with only one inch to spare.

- Remodel and update the science classroom


Why \$16 million?

The amount of the bond is \$16 million, based on an analysis to keep the annual tax rate close to the same as last year's. The annual tax rate is approximately \$2.66 per \$1,000 of taxable assessed value. The previous bond was recently paid off, this bond will essentially replace it.

Should we pass the bond, the state will award Sheridan School District \$4 million in a grant, additional funding for capital improvements.

The process of creating the list of items centered on improved student and staff safety, immediate maintenance needs, the education of our students and the ability to serve the Sheridan community.


