You are only in control of your part in the scene. You can't play someone else's role in the conversations or life. A Message from the Sheridan Superintendent

Dear Sheridan Families,

The proposed budget for the 2022-23 school year includes the general fund and several grants. The total amount, \$19,024,016, will support student health and safety, smaller class sizes in the primary grades, small group academic intervention, and English Language Arts curriculum adoption.

In support of student health and safety we added an assistant principal position to the high school and created a student manager position. The student manager position will work with students and families to improve attendance and assist with schoolwide safety concerns. Both positions will focus on creating a safe and welcoming high school environment.

Other additions to the budget include a designated health teacher for grades 6 - 12 and a school health manager (district nurse). The health teacher will facilitate our substance abuse prevention committee, working closely with Yamhill County services, and our families dealing with student substance abuse. Our school health manager, coming to us from the Willamette Education Service District, will support student health protocols, train staff, and be a resource for Sheridan families.

Grant funds will provide an elementary teaching position, allowing for smaller class sizes as we address the student learning needs coming out of the 2020-21 and 2021-22 school years. Federal grant funds support small group reading instruction while the general fund provides a teacher to provide small group math instruction. In the coming school year we will use our district assessment to monitor the growth of students in reading and math.

I would like to thank our business manager, Karen Daniels, and the Sheridan School District Budget Committee for their hard work and dedication for the development of our budget for the 2022-2023 school year.

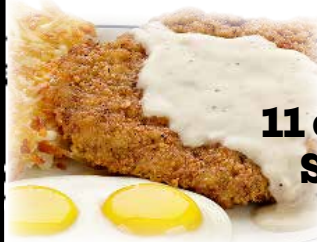

GARAGE SALE Permits Required

Permits are required for garage, yard, basement, porch, estate, moving sales and flea markets or any other sale of tangible personal property. It's Easy! Permit applications are available online at www.cityofsheridanor.com. Once the application is submitted, we will generate the permit and email it to the applicant. The permit can be printed and posted at the location or kept available on the applicant's mobile or electronic device. Please call City Hall if you are having problems with the permit application.

Permits will only be issued between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday and between 8:30 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. on Fridays.

General Regulations:

- **Four Sales** allowed per calendar year; each sale may be three consecutive days with hours between 8 a.m. and 7 p.m.
- Items for sale may not be displayed on any City of Sheridan right-of-way and may not block emergency personnel access.
- All items not sold must be removed right away.
- Sold items must be removed within 24 hours.



Signs:

- **NO signs** allowed on any public right-of-way.
- **NO signs** allowed on utility poles, street signs or traffic control signs.
- **Two signs** (No larger than 6 sq. ft. each) permitted on property where sale is held.
- **Four signs** (No larger than 4 sq. ft. each) permitted on property other than where sale is to be held, provided that the sale property is not on a major thoroughfare (Hwy 18B). Written permission must be obtained from property owners where signs are placed.
- **ALL SIGNS** must be removed once the sale ends.

The Dispatcher

The phone rings, "Thank you for choosing Marriott Hotels." That's funny, I have never stayed in a Marriott Hotel, yet I've received this same call every other day for years, and it's the same recorded voice each time. Then, these dialers change the name, inserting a new hotel in the same sentence, "Thank you for choosing (Hilton) Hotels." Nice try. I am also not in the market for Hilton Hotels. The prerecorded message was identical to the first, but the producers of the assault adlibbed it up a little, replacing Marriott with Hilton. It was mind-blowing. It felt like I was in the kids' playroom years back learning animal sounds from that See and Say farm toy, but it was now possessed or reprogrammed. "The cow goes... moo," you again pull that red arm down this time randomly, "The cow goes... Hilton." Same boring cow, now with a different call. What are these people probing for?

I'm out here answering calls from area codes and prefixes that I'm accustomed to seeing, (503) 472 or 434. "All aboard, this is your captain speaking..." I hang up. Oh, captain, not my captain; I've never been on a cruise ship. The audacity of these people declaring who my captain is while I'm landlocked! When you call it back, "Do DOO DOIT, we're sorry, the number you have dialed is no longer in service." Was it ever?

This nonstop onslaught started a few years back when I went to a small wireless company, and they auto generated a new phone number for me, not knowing that a man in his retirement years previously owned it. The new number would soon knight me into a small part of his family as "The Dispatcher." On Father's Day 2019, none of my children called me. Instead, three different grandchildren did. "Happy Father's Day, Grandpa." I am not a grandfather. Holding my frustrations back, I repeat, "Wrong number," hanging up, over and over again, writing it off as more unwanted phone calls.

A month later, the "Happy Birthday Grandpa" calls started on my way to work. It was another busy Wednesday, so I became a little excited after the third call came in, "Hello?" "Hey, you are not Glen! Is Glen there?" "No. I am not Glen," I broke down, explaining that I acquired this number months ago, and on

holidays the calls were nonstop. The man laughed, telling me that he was an old golfing buddy with "Glen," and they converse daily on the internet. So, I continued my day job while this golfing pro went to Facebook and helped clear up the problem for me. The whole time we shot the breeze, I finally got a number to refer that one noodle-headed grandchild to call for the good wishes. Note: only his grandchildren call me!

With The golfing pro's help, I could redirect some of the calls, but the real problem remained.... All these marketers, or as I think of them, scammers, are bombing my phone every day. First, you give up and hear the message, listening for the option to be put on a no-call list. When "Press 0 to be removed from this call list" pops up, you push the number hidden at the

end of the story. Yet, the calls increase the following week; they use this tool to confirm that a warm body is on the other end and is ready for the taking. By just picking up the call, it feels like you've become confirmed as a possible target. After a bit of internet searching, I found that according to AARP, the "All Aboard" free cruise ship scam is a way for these aggressive monsters to lock down your Social Security and credit card numbers before you even know what you have won.

Often, this grift tricks you into calling back a 1-900 number, but times have changed. If you dial a 1-809, 1-868, or 1-876, you can get charged as if it was a hotline; allegedly, these numbers are valid in the United States, making them money harvesting hubs. No longer does the number have to start with a 9 for

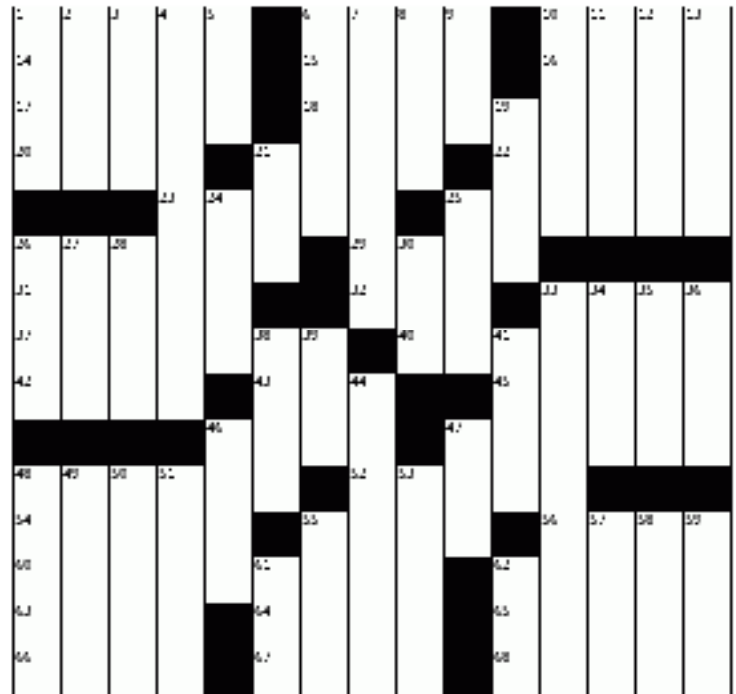
