SHS Returns to Closed Campus

Sheridan High School has returned to a closed campus policy, which was approved by the school board at its July meeting. A recommendation to close the campus came from the district's substance abuse task force, a move intended to increase high school students health and safety rates.

The closed campus policy means freshmen students will not be permitted to leave campus at lunchtime.

Sophomores, juniors, and seniors will be permitted to leave campus at lunchtime by presenting an off-campus ticket as they exit through the front door of the building at lunchtime.

Students can earn off-campus tickets each semester based on school attendance and grades.

For the fall semester, students must attend at least 80% and have passed all classes for the spring semester of 2022.

For the spring semester of 2023, attendance must be 85% or better, and students must have passed all classes in the fall semester of 2022.

School officials said they set the bar at 80% due to a clear distinction in the attendance data from the previous year. They felt if they put it above 80%, many students would be unable to go

off campus. The school's administration team plans to gradually increase the expected attendance rate until they reach the state's expectation of 92%.

Tickets were distributed to students who earned them on the first day of school. The policy allows for the discretion of the administration or designee to determine if students can leave campus. Students can appeal to administrators every six weeks to earn a ticket for the remainder of the semester.

Students may lose or gain their privilege at any time based on grades, attendance, or behavior. "This policy is in place because we must do better with our attendance this year. Students learn better in person, with opportunities for peer collaboration. In addition, having students in the building all day will decrease absences and tardies after lunch," said Sheridan School District Superintendent Dorie Vickery.



Community Leaders Provide Assistance For Those Affected by Power Shut-Off

On Sunday, Portland General Electric finalized restoration to customers impacted by the company's proactive public safety power shut-off (PSPS) and preventive power shut-offs implemented on Sept. 9 and 10.

The power was shut off Friday afternoon and restored Saturday afternoon in this area.

Safety measures affecting 17 areas and approximately 37,000 customers were taken in response to extreme fire conditions and hot, strong wind gusts.

PGE worked closely with community leaders and emergency responders.

The City of Sheridan responded proactively to the potential PSPS and requested a PGE mobile unit be available to provide water, ice, and charging stations.

The Sheridan School District hosted the cooling station set up for charging phones and offered a microwave, ice, porta-potties, wash stations, and more from 7 a.m. until 7 p.m. on both Friday and Saturday.

A Message from the Sheridan Superintendent

Dear Sheridan Families,

Recently the Sheridan community had the unfortunate experience of a PGE Public Safety Power Shut-off (PSPS). Given the first experience of a PSPS, there were naturally some challenges to work through. Here is a brief summary of what we learned:

- Sheridan is referred to on the PGE map as area 10, Southern West Hills.
- PGE will give a range of time for an expected power shut-off.
- Sheridan School District facilities are not in the area for a PSPS, and therefore we will remain open.
- If Sheridan School District should have a situation of no power, we will send notification out to parents of an emergency school closure.
- The City's Water Treatment Plant is in a PSPS Zone so it will operate from a generator. During times when the PSPS is activated, the City encourages water customers to halt outdoor water usage.
- When reading the PGE map, the purple area designates the region of high risk. When the PSPS is activated, the purple area will turn yellow.
- The length of time for the PSPS is up to four days. PGE crews will need to check power lines before removing the PSPS. Implementing a PSPS is a last resort safety measure when wildfire danger exists. PSPS high risk areas were selected using the latest scientific data and risk modeling, looking at important factors like temperatures, vegetation, humidity and wind speeds.

Also taken into consideration are the beautiful trees we enjoy, with leaves that create more weight to fall onto power lines, which could spark a fire. The other consideration is our available workforce of firefighters. Our region has a significant shortage of trained firefighters, and the Sheridan Fire District is constantly recruiting and training new volunteers.

For the future workforce development, the Sheridan Fire District and Sheridan School District will partner to create a pipeline of training our high school students for EMT/Firefighting.

The City of Sheridan responded proactively to the potential PSPS and requested a PGE Mobile Unit be available to provide water, ice, and charging stations.

As a community, the City of Sheridan, Sheridan Fire District, and Sheridan School District work together to serve our families. There is ongoing communication, sharing updates, resources, and any important information that needs to be sent to the community. It is unfortunate that September has become our wildfire alert month. But thankfully, we have a strong community that works together to support each other during emergency situations.


He will be missed by many.

dividuals enrolled in the Yamhill Community Care Organization health plan (YCCO).

Transportation to and from covered health service appointments is available for those with no other options, such as friends or family.

Covered appointments include primary care and specialist visits, physical therapy, dental care, mental health, and dialysis appointments.

WellRide services include bus fare for the Yamhill County transit area, mileage reimbursements (must be pre-approved), wheelchair lift and ramp vans, sedans and taxis, stretcher cars for those who must lie down for transport, and secured vehicles. WellRide services are a covered Medicaid benefit with zero cost to the individual. Sometimes a personal care attendant can also ride along at no charge.

To use WellRide, individuals

must call and provide the following information: current YCCO ID number, home address and phone number, mailing address, pick-up address, appointment address, including the building name and suite number, appointment date and time, name and telephone number of the provider, the reason for the appointment and any transportation requirements such as a wheelchair or other assistance. Appointments must be made at least two business days in advance. Cancellations must be made as soon as possible, at least one hour before the sched-







The beginning band will consist primarily of the fifth grade, the intermediate, the sixth grade and the advanced, the seventh and eighth grades.


Students Invited to Play in High School Band; Join Chorus


