

If not, please stop by our main station at 230 S.W. Mill St. and pick one up. If you have questions, give us a call.

There is still time to sign up for FireMed for yourself or coverage for friends or family members. Need the perfect gift for the person who has everything? You could give them a year's membership to FireMed and/or Life Flight.

Moving back into the main station after seismic upgrades triggered other issues. Our phone system and internet service need upgrading. In the meantime, we've had dropped calls, faxes, and scans that did not go through. We are working with our phone, internet, and IT providers to remedy these problems.

Now that the Burn season has opened, we receive regular calls from people requesting backyard and slash-burning information. Unfortunately, the Yamhill County burn line has been down on multiple occasions. For backyard burning questions, call 503-472-3344. Feel free to contact the fire station if your questions still need to be answered. We will help you get the information you need. The Oregon Department of Forestry issues slash-burning permits; call the Dallas unit at 503-934-8146 for more information.


