



While patrons at the Riverside Cafe were concerned last Tuesday that the City of Sheridan's Public Works crew were taking down the Christmas lights, they were actually adding more lights. In fact, they were installing Edison lights that will remain in the plaza year-around. Edison lights are modern, reproduction bulbs that harken back to the very first light bulb made by Thomas Edison in 1879: a glass vacuum globe that lets you see through to the filament inside. Where the original incandescent bulbs used carbon filaments, the modern versions uses a filament with a thin LED strip. The result is a modern take on an old classic. These lights can change color and flash. For example, explained Public Works Supervisor Kenny _______, the lights can be red for Christmas, but later changed to green for St. Patrick's Day, etc.



A Tribute to Nanette "Grandma" LaRue



Nanette I. (Jetton) LaRue June 1938-Dec. 2022

With immense sadness, the family shares the sudden passing of Nanette LaRue.

Nanette was born in 1938 to Martin and Helen (Robertson) Jetton. She later married Owen LaRue, and in 1967 her family moved to Oregon so that she could be near her parents.

She began working at a young age, and her family said she developed a strong work ethic. She had little interest in slowing down and retiring. Her daughter, Lynette (LaRue) Donnelly, remarked how she had run an in-home daycare for years and often wouldn't take payment so she could help struggling families. In the 1980's she worked at Faulconer Champman School (FCS) in the laundry room and then in the kitchen. She later became an instructional assistant at the school. She was always donating her time or items whenever she saw a need. After she finally did retire, she continued to run circles around others. Her daughter. Lynette, recalled that she once watched a show on TV about a couple in Alaska that had been taking food to the people that lived on a nearby tiny island, but their boat had run into repair issues. They were asking for the public's help to fix it so they could continue providing food to the islanders. After Nanette saw this, she instantly sent a check to help them with repairs.

Her daughter also described how she would often go to her neighbors' houses if she saw that they had fruits or vegetables that were not being eaten and ask if she could take some for those in need. She would then preserve the food and give it to homeless persons or anyone she thought might need it. She also volunteered at a Sheridan senior meal site, the Golden Kitchen, preparing and serving meals to the elderly.

Nanette loved children. Tim Hart, who worked and knew Nanette for about twenty-five years, said that many of the children that attended FCS would affectionately call her "Grandam" or "Rue." Tim remembered that she was always ready to take the kids out for recess, rain or shine, no matter the weather. About twenty years ago, Tim said that the faculty wanted to recognize Nanette's support for the school and community, so they voted to name the eighth-grade citizenship award for FCS in her honor. He also recalled that she never handed out the award herself because she was never one to seek recognition. "She only did what was right for the kids," he said, "She was always there for any kids, and she really was Grandma to so many kids in the town."

Over the years, she had over a hundred foster kids. DHS placed these kids, or she saw a need in the community and provided temporary shelter for a child. Her daughter said she always knew when a kid needed something. Her daughter lamented that she was active in her kids, foster kids, and grandchildren's lives. She took the time to teach them and always tried to lead by example.

According to her daughter, she wasn't keen on public speaking. Still, she spoke to the Sheridan City Council, along with others from the Sheridan Community Youth Organization, about the importance of continuing to allow chickens to be raised in Sheridan. She saw the chickens as an excellent tool for a child's development. She used the chickens to teach the kids how to care for and raise animals and foster a good work ethic.

She was highly active in the Sheridan Church of the Nazarene community. Her daughter remarked that one could usually find her at church seven days a week. She did various tasks at the church, including youth group leadership and secretary, among others. She inspired many of her youth group kids to become youth group leaders themselves by her example.

The people who knew her know that there are no words to do her justice, and her family says she will be missed beyond words and that they take comfort in knowing that she is with the Lord and her husband and son, Terry.

She is survived by her children, Valerie (Tim) Holsclaw, Victor (Lucinda) LaRue, and Lynette (Todd) Donnelly; as well as seven grandchildren; 11 great-grandchildren; and one great-greatgrandchild.




