### Cheesy Garlic Pull-Apart Bread INGREDIENTS

1 large baguette

1 stick butter, melted 6 cloves garlic, minced 2 tbsp. freshly chopped parsley Kosher salt

Freshly ground black pepper 1 c. shredded mozzarella

1 c. shredded fontina

#### DIRECTIONS

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Using a serrated knife, crosshatch baguette, making slices every inch in both directions and making sure to not slice all the way through the bottom of baguette.

In a small bowl, stir together melted butter, garlic, and parsley. Season with salt and pepper. Brush baguette with melted butter mixture, making sure to get inside crosshatches.

Stuff each crosshatch with mozzarella and fontina and wrap bread completely in foil.

Bake until cheese is melted and bread is warm and toasty, about 20 minutes.

Let cool 5 minutes, then serve as is or with a dipping sauce such as marinara, or melted garlic butter.




My dad wanted my little brother to be tough, boxing, etc. He already was great at pushing – pushing me off of my stool as I did my chores, dishes, baking tins, etc.

## Last Week's Photo Mystery Revealed

This photo was in last week's issue of The Bulletin Board. Readers were asked about the small glass and metal object at the top of a thin pole attached to a Sheridan building.

Readers in the know and those willing to make a creative guess were asked to email their responses to bulletin@wavecable. com.

The Bulletin Board promised to reveal all the details provided by a life-long Sheridanite in this week's issue.

Curious-minded folks will find this little treasure on South Bridge Street on the top southwest corner of Benny Huie's. It's at the top left of Bennie's green awning, a couple of feet back from the front of the building.

"It's been there since 1954 or 1955," said Val Adamson.

"Back in the day, police walked the beat in Sheridan, usually at night, which meant they walked through town checking on businesses to be sure they were locked and all was well. Of course, they also walked through the bars, etc.

"The police didn't have pagers or portable radios in those days. When they were out of their cars, dispatch would flip on the red light (shown above) if you needed them. As the officers walked around town, they kept an eye out for it. If they saw the red light, they'd get to their cars as quickly as they could and radio in for information.

A similar fixture was located next to Sheridan Pharmacy in those days, giving visibility for most downtown areas.

"This was well before we had YCOM," said Val. "Sheridan handled its own police business at that time."

The funeral home handled fire and police calls from 5 p.m. until 8 a.m. back then. Val took on this duty part-time when he was in the eighth grade and worked in this capacity well into his teen years.

Citizens who needed police or fire services would call the phone number for whichever service they needed, but the phones would ring at Val's house.

When Val received a call for police service in the evening, he would turn on the red lights downtown. He said the switch looked just like a light switch you would have in your house. For fire calls, he'd push a button to turn on the town's fire alarm that called firefighters into the station.

Val explained that the building at 148 S. Bridge Street, which has "City Hall" at the top, never really served as City Hall. He said the City had a small office there, but it mainly housed the police and fire departments, with the library located upstairs.

This building, constructed in 1916 with a \$6,000 bond passed by Sheridan voters in 1915, also contained the city jail. Which, Val said, is still there. He explained that, for many years, the city offices were in Dr. Wilbur's old office across the street.

Kelli Williams of Kelli's Kuts has returned to Sheridan and once again offers \$10 haircuts, beard trims, and facial waxing services. Kelli is a 1988 graduate of Multnomah School of Hair Design who has 35 years of experience. For 13 years, she worked at the Great Clips near Walmart in Mc-Minnville.

She has two sons, David, currently a sophomore at Sheridan High School, and Caleb, an eighth-grade student at Faulconer Chapman.

While working in McMinnville, Kelly enjoyed many customers from Grand Ronde, Willamina, and Sheridan. Many of these folks accompanied several kids or elderly parents, driving many

miles to Great Clips in McMinnville for more affordable haircuts. So Kelly thought opening a new salon in the West Valley would offer the community a more convenient, less expensive service.

When Kelly first returned to Sheridan, she opened her shop in a space inside the Monroe Event Center.

On Nov. 2, she moved her shop to 144 E. Main Street in Sheridan. She is now open for business next door to Main Street Books Revisited. She is in the same building with Curls, Cuts, and More, and The Bulletin Board.

Kelli's Kut's hours are 10 a.m.-5 p.m. Tuesday through Friday;

and 10 a.m.-2 p.m. on Saturdays. No appointment is necessary. Kelly loves cutting hair for kids, the elderly, and everyone in between. Haircuts cost \$10 for all styles, from buzz cuts to the more complex "high and tights" and A-Lines. She does not offer chemical services, no perms or specialties, just haircuts, beard trims, and facial waxing services. Kelli's first Sheridan salon was located at 120 SW Monroe Street, next to Hagen Hamilton insurance. Unfortunately, Covid-19 forced her to close this shop. Her last day of operation there was Mar. 19, 2020. She sold her Sheridan home, and she and her sons moved to Cathlamet, Wash., to open another



shop. Kelli is a single mom with bills to pay and boys to raise, so not working was not an option for her.

But, she and her boys missed Sheridan and their friends. Kelli had kept in touch with her Sheridan friends while away and decided it was a good time to return.

Kelli said she plans to offer honest, quality service to the West Valley community.

She also plans to continue with her generous offer to help the Grand Sheramina Food Bank. Patrons who bring in one can of food for donation to the food bank will receive \$2 off their haircut or waxing service.



Curt Edmondson and John Bargero, owners of the property located at 106 S. Bridge, hired Green Deconstruction Services, Inc. (GDSI) to clean up this pile of debris that contains asbestos. The building collapsed last January, less than two full days after Curt and John purchased the property. The new owners have been working on the cleanup since that time. The City of Sheridan is involved because former City Manager Frank Sheridan permitted them to place the materials on this city-owned property. GDSI expected to complete the job within a few days. GDSI will truck the material to the Hillsboro Landfill area equipped to handle materials containing asbestos. Jacob, who has been with GDSI for about five years, said he has talked with the neighbors a couple of times, and they are pleased to see this material moved off the property.

The driver proceeded to smash into two vehicles located in the driveway next door at 526 Sheridan Road. The truck came to a stop as it hit this house.

The driver fled the scene, but witnesses say he was quickly apprehended hiding behind a tree next to nearby railroad tracks. A paramedic said the driver suffered a cut on his chin as a result of the crash. He was arrested and transported to the hospital for evaluation of any further injuries and was then lodged in the county jail. He will face three felony charges for assaulting a public safety officer, endangering a person protected by a restraining order, and fleeing or attempting to elude police officers. He has also been charged with 10 additional misdemeanors.

The last class to graduate from this old school was in 2003. The building sat empty for several years before a private party purchased it in 2011.

In 2013, the West Valley Community Campus nonprofit organization was formed, and the board obtained a 501c3. Community work parties were held to save the building from further disrepair by patching the roof, cleaning, painting, installing heating systems, and more.
