



The Holidays are supposed to be a time to celebrate each other and what we have, but they often end up stressing people terribly. Finding the right gift can be ridiculously hard: we all have that family member who buys themselves whatever they want or need, and when birthdays and holidays come around, we're left wondering what the heck we could possibly get or do for them. If you're creative, Pinterest has a million ideas for what you could make someone. If you're rich, buying something really nice is no big deal, but most of us don't have a big budget for gifts. For everyone else, here is a list of inexpensive items that might make somebody smile.


Sheridan Churches from the Late 1800s to Early 1900s




Good Shepherd Catholic Church, located on E. Main and Ash Street in Sheridan, was built around 1910. It is still in good shape today, but is minus the bell tower. This building has served as the church hall since a newer church was built next door.



Trinity Lutheran Church in approximately 1908 on 2nd Street (now Sheridan Road. This church was torn down and replaced in 1991. A. Gutbrod donated this property to the church on Sept. 23, 1907.



The Congregational Church was built in 1892/93 at 220 SW Monroe Street. It later served as the Mennonite Church for several years. The Assembly of God congregation was the next owner, until they sold to the Sheridan Baptist Church. Dick Jordan purchased the old church in 1996 and converted it into a four bedroom house. The original siding and bell tower remains, but the tall steeple has been removed.



The Methodist Church was built in 1873/74 at a cost of \$2,938.79. The above photo was taken in 1908 after the floor was raised and a lower floor was added. A new brick sanctuary was added on in 1953. The building was used for another 55 years before it was destroyed by fire in 2008. The current church was then constructed at the same location and was dedicated on Jan. 9, 2011.
