A Message From Code Enforcement

A common question has arisen: what is a code enforcement violation, and how are complaints processed?

Code Violations come in a variety of forms. Some of the most common include rodent infestations, weeds, noxious growth, trash and debris on private property, unlawful chickens, exterior property maintenance standards, fence maintenance, and illegal parking on private property.

On our City website: www.cityofsheridanor.com, there is a link titled Report of Concern, located at the bottom of the page.

When these forms are completed, they route to the code enforcement officer.

The code enforcement officer goes through a process of verification regarding the property's tenants, legal owner, and potential specific code violations submitted. After the verification process is completed, it is then time to inspect.

An initial site inspection will be conducted once a complaint has been received. If the complaints are valid, the property owner and tenants will be notified to bring the property into compliance with the City codes.

A second inspection will be scheduled within ten days to see if compliance has been reached. At the time of inspection, if a property is found to no longer be out of compliance, the case will be closed, and no other action will be taken.

If a violation persists passed three notices of violation, the property owner may be issued a municipal court citation. If the property still lacks compliance with City codes after court, the property may face abatement by the City and a lien filed against the property.

A Message from the Sheridan Superintendent

Dear Sheridan Families,

For the 2023-24 school year I am proposing a calendar change that we move to a four-day instructional week. Students would attend Monday - Thursday, with a longer instructional day. FCS students would attend 8:15 - 3:15, SHS students would attend 8:00 - 3:35. The new schedule is designed to create more time for staff training so that we may better address the needs of our students. Here are the key points of the instructional change:

- Monday-Thursday will be longer instructional days for students. Teachers will work an 8.5 hour day.
- Friday will be for meetings, training, and teacher work time. Teachers will work a six hour day.
- Grade days and parent-teacher conferences will also be on Fridays.
- The three weeks where there is a holiday on a Monday, we will have school on Friday.
- This model is an increase of 1.5 days of instruction.

Some of the challenges include:

- Not having meals provided for our students on Fridays.
- Childcare issues for families.
- Practices for sports would be pushed back Monday - Thursday, to a later start time.
- A longer instructional day for younger children.

A parent survey regarding this change had 147 responses. Of those completing the survey, 15.6% said that childcare would be an issue, 17% said childcare might be an issue, and 67.3% said that childcare would not be an issue. The other question, "I am in favor of this calendar change" had 77.6% saying "yes."

The next step will be for the calendar to go to the School Board for approval at our June 21 meeting. If you have questions about this change, please contact me at the district office, 971-261-6959.

45 Sheridan High School Seniors Tossed Caps in the Air Ending an Era

Sheridan High School's 45 seniors became graduates Saturday afternoon.

The ceremony, in the school stadium, started with students, joining two by two from opposite directions to walk to their chairs while the band played "Pomp and Circumstance," directed by Mr. Derek Tripp.

Principal Jason Hohnbaum, after thanking custodians and office staff for preparing the ceremony, noted that it was Sheridan's 119th graduating class.

Dorie Vickery, superintendent of the Sheridan School District, then introduced the School Board.

Salutatorian Lilly Barnes made a brief address thanking school personnel for their work in preparing class members for their next moves.

Next to speak was Bryanah Lopez, president of the student body.

"No matter what you do (after graduation), she said, "you have all made an impact on people's lives."

Bryanah lead the audience in singing happy birthday to valedictori-

an Kaihdan Trombla.

He then thanked family members of the seniors and wished all his fellow graduates the best. After his brief speech, the school choir sang "You Raise Me Up."

The principal speaker, William "Randy" Rorrer, started his remarks with "This is only the end of the first chapter of an interesting book." He spoke of what he considered the most important qualities for a graduate: determination, dependability, accountability, positivity and camaraderie.

"You have many more milestones to look forward to," he said.

Rorrer, who has been a teacher, an athletic director and a baseball coach, also announced that he is retiring.

Hohnbaum noted that the seniors had earned a total of \$832,000 in scholarships and a total of 82 college credits. He concluded the ceremonies by announcing the graduates individually and their plans.

Locally Sourced Recipe for Locally Sourced Ingredients

Berry season is here in Willamette Valley, and it's my favorite time of year!

This is a go-to recipe of mine that is a twist on traditional strawberry jam. Try it on toast or a banana split topping on a hot summer day.

Strawberry Margarita Jam

INGREDIENTS:

- 3 cups crushed strawberries (about 6 cups whole berries)
 - ½ cup lime juice
 - ½ cup tequila
 - ¼ cup Triple Sec or other orange liqueur
 - 6 cup sugar
 - 3 ounces liquid fruit pectin
 - 1 teaspoon finely shredded lime peel
- Directions:

In an 8- to 10-quart heavy pot, combine strawberries, lime juice, tequila, and Triple Sec. Stir in sugar. Bring mixture to a full rolling boil, stirring constantly. Quickly stir in pectin and lime peel. Return to a full rolling boil, stirring constantly. Boil hard for 1 minute, stirring constantly. Remove from heat and quickly skim off the foam with a metal spoon. Save the foam refrigerated in a separate jar to use within

a week. It's excellent on waffles. Ladle hot jam into hot sterilized half-pint canning jars, leaving a 1/4-inch headspace. Wipe jar rims; adjust lids and screw bands.

Process filled jars in a boiling-water canner for 5 minutes (start timing when water returns to boiling). Remove jars from the canner, and cool on wire racks. (It is normal for fruit to float to the top as the jam cools.) Makes 7 half-pints.

Canning tips:

- Never use jars with chips or cracks.
- Always use fresh lids and only use them once.
- Always sterilize jars, lids, and rings.
- I highly recommend downloading the USDA complete guide to home canning for anyone new to canning or as a refresher course for seasoned canners.

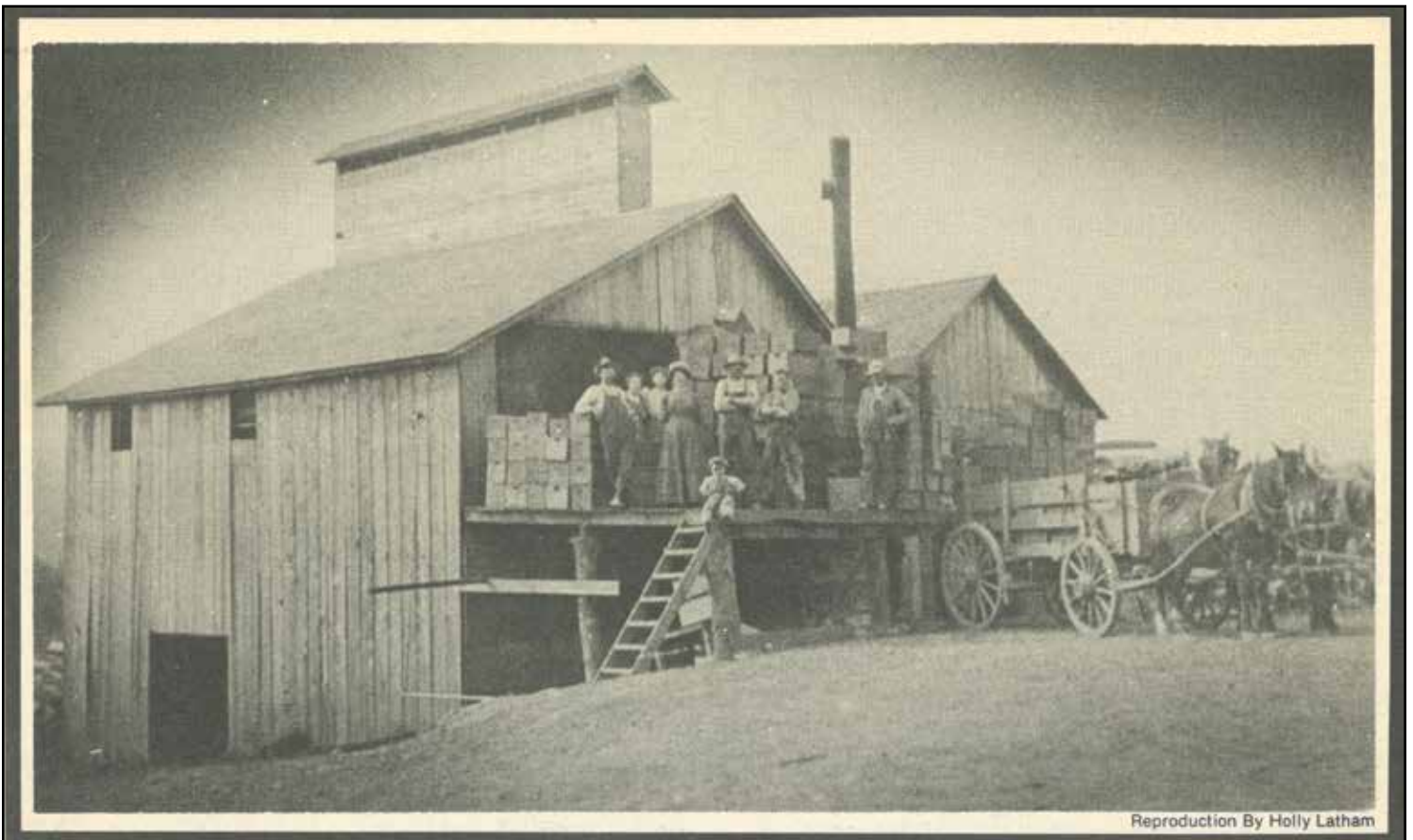
