



As February winds down the anticipation of warmer weather and spring school events brings a renewed sense of purpose. We are very excited to celebrate postseason participation for all of our Varsity Winter sports programs.

Our boys and girls wrestling team departed Thursday to compete in the 2A state wrestling tournament in Portland. We had 16 athletes competing. After winning the district title, our boys teams will be sent 13 athletes to the state tournament; Grayson Hubbard, Eden Stanton, Kisor Savage, Adoniyah Stanton, Devin Huston, Fomel Isiordia, Kaden Konovalov, Orrin Reid, Cameron Russell, Finnian Clemans, Bodhi Baller, Landon Risseeuw, and Rhyne Nelson. Grayson, Kisor, Finnian, and Bodhi were all league champions in their weight class.

Our girls team blazed a trail this year, with more than a dozen girls practicing and competing throughout the season. The future looks very bright for these amazing athletes. Our girls finished ninth at the district tournament out of 48 schools, where eight girls competed, four placed in the top six, and three qualified for state next weekend! Traveling to the state tournament were Zoe Brewer, Sadie Risseeuw, and Paige Baker. Zoe was honored as district champion and is the number one seed at 100lb going into the state meet. We are proud of our competitors at the state tournament! Kisor Savage, our highest placer, came home with a second place at 120 lbs and the boys team earned second place overall. Zoe Brewer made history, as our first girl's state champion in the 100 lb division!

Our boys and girls Varsity basketball teams also made it to the first round of the state playoffs. Our boys team hosted Grant Union Saturday February 24 at 2:00 pm. The boys are currently ranked number 6 and with the win they travel to Pendleton for the Elite Eight tournament next weekend. Several boys were honored with all-league awards; Cohen Haller was selected first team and defensive all-star, Adam Atherton and Dylan Graham were selected to second team, and Kaleb Cruickshank and Saxon Stockwell received honorable mention honors.

Our girls team traveled to Enterprise for a Saturday first round state playoff game. Unfortunately the final score wasn't what we hoped for, but they are a young team with great expectations for next year. We had five girls recognized for their talents at the district tournament last week; freshman Hadley Hughes was selected to the first team, junior Bayleigh Leno received third team honors, and junior Zoie Sickles, freshman Grace Terbush, and senior Sandra Laguna (our foreign exchange student from Spain) were given honorable mention awards.

Sweet and Savory Apple Pie Baked Beans



1 Bush's Original Baked Beans 55 ounce can 1 pound bacon, cooked and

chopped

1 pound Pork Sausage 1/2 - white onion, chopped

2 colored bell pepper, chopped 2 Large Fresh Apples, medium cut (1/4" pieces)

1 cup your favorite BBQ sauce (I use Kinder's Hot Honey and remove Jalepenos)

2 jalapenos, chopped (optional) 2-3 tablespoons yellow mustard 2 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce your favorite pork rub

¹/₂ - cup brown sugar

In a large pot

1. Cook Bacon, pull and set aside, chop when cooled.

2. Cook pork sausage on medium heat along with bell pepper, onion and jalapeno.

3. Once onions are translucent, add apples and cook until apples soften slightly.

If cooking in crock pot (high heat) or same pot (medium/low heat)

 Add in beans, BBQ sauce, mustard, brown sugar, and Worcestershire. Fold in gently.
Continue cooking, stirring on

occasion, until reaches desired temperature.

If finishing on smoker

1. Add contents of pot and beans to cast iron Dutch oven or large aluminum pan.

2. Smoke for 2-3 hours at 250-275 degrees, stirring on occasion.

Sheridan FireMed An Emergency Ambulance Membership Program

No one likes to be faced with unexpected bills. An ambulance ride can be expensive, and insurance may not cover all emergency medical transportation costs. Membership in the Sheridan FireMed program can help offer peace of mind by protecting you from unforeseen emergency expenses. The cost is \$75 for one year.

How does it work? When you enroll as a FireMed member, your membership fee helps enhance EMS services by allowing the fire district to invest in lifesaving equipment and highly skilled personnel. When you have a medical emergency requiring transportation to a hospital, the fire district will accept your insurance payment as payment in full. FireMed members have no out-of-pocket expenses for emergency medical transport costs. (FireMed does not cover minor medical problems and non-emergency services.)

Sheridan Fire District has partnered with Life Flight Network. For \$140/year, you can enroll in both ground (FireMed) and air (Life Flight) coverage.

FireMed and/or Life Flight memberships are not an insurance policy. They are secondary to insurance carriers. All available insurance will be billed first. You do not have to have insurance to be a FireMed member. Anyone living in Sheridan Fire District is eligible to enroll. This includes the City of Sheridan and the communities of Ballston, Buell, and Bellevue, as well as the outlying areas.

You can enroll in our FireMed membership program any time of the year. New and lapsed membership becomes effective 72 hours after receipt of payment and is good for one year. Membership forms and brochures are available at the Sheridan Fire District Main Station, 230 SW Mill Street, or online at www.sheridanfd.org. (Look under the Services Tab.) The website also has a link to the Life Flight website if you would like to get dual FireMed/ Life Flight Network coverage or enroll and pay for either or both online.

FireMed is an emergency ground transportation membership program that helps to cover the costs* of medically necessary transports via ambulance.* What Does it Cover?

For one small fee, your annual FireMed subscription gives you continuous coverage during the current membership year. Emergency transports to the nearest appropriate hospital* are covered for your entire family*. (Non-emergency services and treat and release are not covered.)

What Does it Cost?

•Ground ambulance transportation membership is just \$75.00 per benefit year (November 1st through October 31st).

•Your entire household* is covered for one low membership fee. •Open enrollment is September 1st through October 31st of each year.

•Memberships expire on October 31st of each benefit period.





U.S. Bank Celebrates 30 Year Birthday

It's going to be the U.S. National Bank's 30th birthday in Sheridan next week, and it's also time to dedicate a new drive-in window and mail drop facilities. Here's a history of the bank.

Scroggin & Wortman Bank, established in 1892 by P.M. Scroggin, his two sons, Tom and Steve, and Jacob Wortman, was the first bank to start business in Sheridan. In 1894, upon the death of P.M. Scroggin, The Scroggin brothers bought out Mr. Wortman's interest, and the bank was known as the Scroggin Brothers Bank until it was chartered as the First National Bank in 1907.

It bore this name until 1949 when it became the Sheridan Branch of the U.S. National Bank of Portland. At that time, the bank employed seven full-time and one part-time employees.

The bank has been in continuous operation from the date of its organization, and until 1949, it had some members of the Scroggin family as an officer of the bank. The late T.J. Scroggin was president of the bank at the time of the take-over on February 27, 1949, at which time loans totaled \$735,325 and the deposits \$2,797,909.

The original office was located on the corner of Bridge and Monroe streets, where the parking lot and drive-in window are now located. The present building was built in 1951 and dedicated in 1952. For quite some time, the Sheridan branch was an experimental branch for various programs. On November 1, 1956, Sheridan Branch, U.S. National Bank, was the first bank in the world to rely on electronic postings of checking accounts. The original posting was quite crude compared to the more sophisticated system in use today.

In the late 1950s' an officer's training program was established by the U.S. National Bank of Oregon. Sheridan branch participated in this program and has trained a number of young people who have become officers in our various branches throughout the state, as well as other financial institutions.

Today, at the Sheridan branch, there are nine full-time and four part-time employees. The branch loan totals are over \$4,000,000, and the deposits are over \$12,000,000.

J. "Art" Hebert, manager, came to Sheridan in March 1949 as note teller from the U.S. National Bank in Omaha,

Neb., where he served as a commercial teller. Since that time, he has been quite active in community affairs, as well as serving on the board of directors of Chemeketa Community College for the past ten years.

Elizabeth Britt, P.S.R. and secretary, started her career in 1944 for T.J. Scroggin. She worked for 2¹/₂ years, took several years off, and returned to work for U.S. National in April 1949.

Both Art and Liz will celebrate 30 years with U.S. Bank also.


